I want to share a few things with you that help make our partnership a great success:

- Parents of students in <u>preschool</u>, check your child's tote bag EACH DAY for teacher and school communications as well as student work.
- 2. Kindergarten to grade 5 parents:
  - A. Sign or initial your child's *Agenda* each day and review teacher notes, assignments, and reminders.
  - B. Parents of students in kindergarten to grade 5, check your child's backpack for his/her "takehome" folder which will contain school notes and student work sometimes requiring your signature and return.
