## **Service Learning**

The CES 4th and 5th grade students have participated in collecting items for Love INC, an organization that fills the gaps in local services, by identifying unmet needs in the community. To help them meet their needs the 4th and 5th graders collected non-perishable items, such as granola bars, canned meat and vegetables, crackers, and various other items.

The CES 4th graders then broadened their service learning project and incorporated the food they collected with the H.O.P.E. food collected at weekly chapel from all grades into their study of plants in science. Mrs. Hanes had her students

divide up the donated food items into the parts of a plant: seeds, roots, stems, flowers, leaves, and fruit. This helped them better understand all of the different parts of plants that feed and sustain us.

As of October 30th, the Pumpkin Patch pumpkin sales have totaled \$13,766. Our 33.3% CES percentage is \$4,584. Sales will continue through Halloween and into the beginning of November.
