The CES 1st grade students participated in collecting items for Nacogdoches Core, a local organization dedicated to reducing feline overpopulation through targeted Trap-Neuter-Return programs and community education. The 1st graders and their parents collected cat food, kitty litter, a cat bed, towels, and blankets. The 1st graders also provided homemade cat toys for their furry friends to play with and enjoy.







The CES 5th graders collected snack items to deliver to our Nacogdoches Police Department, Nacogdoches Sheriff's Office, SFA Police, and Deputy Mario Reyna, who works our chapel services. Our students are grateful to our public safety officers for keeping our community safe and for all they do for those of us who live in the city of Nacogdoches and in the surrounding areas in Nacogdoches county.

As of October 31st, the Pumpkin Patch sales totaled \$9,051. Our 33.3% CES percentage is \$3,014, plus an additional amount of \$2,000 in donations and overages. Discounted sales will continue in November.
